Danny Lubisco suggested that between now and January 1st that the limit for number of games that any player can play each week be lifted due to the scarcity of players. Ron Davis stated that the limit was put in place because teams would tend to use the same subs repeatedly. The limit stays.

Danny Lubisco and Jim DeMoto will be giving Bocce tips on Monday at 1 pm.

It was reinforced that every team needs to appoint a captain. This captain's name is to be given to Bob Mullins.

Ron Davis gave a report on referees. Wayne Hoskins will ref Wednesday mornings. Donna Carroll will replace Bob Carson on Thursday mornings. Ron reiterated that subs are allowed to play 2 times a week and regular players may sub 1 time during a week but cannot sub twice in the same morning or in the same afternoon. Ron also said that any grievances must be submitted in writing within 48 hours of the questioned game. There will be a referee meeting on Monday October 30 at 10 am.

Ed stated that Bob Mullins will not be handling scheduling next season and is looking for someone to take over this difficult task.

Tom Cichocki suggested changing the winning score of each game to 11 instead of 14 because of so many games going longer than 1 hour. Bob Haslep stated that the average time for games is under an hour and few games go longer. It was decided to keep the final score of a game at 14.
